'UWAIRJAN


The Bedouin of the Arabian peninsula are well known for their skilfulness in this design. The 'UWAIRJAN, a warp face weave, is a single vertical row of pyramids. Each pyramid is seen either as red 'dots' on a black background or white 'dots', on the black background. The black warp threads are continually interlaced and therefore never float on the reverse of the fabric. The red and white threads when not needed on the face are left to float on the reverse. Floats can vary in length from 1 to 5 cms depending upon their warp position in the pyramid.

The difference between warping the 'UWAIR-JAN and the FLAT WEAVE, is that instead of warping with a single yarn, a red with a white yarn are warped together the length of the warp. The 'UWAIRJAN always starts and finishes with two black threads, and can have either an even or an uneven number of 'dots'.

As with all warp face weaves there are two sheds. The weaver must select from each shed presented to her, the warp threads that she wishes to be on the face of the fabric. She chooses in a predetermined order these warp threads and lets fall to the reverse, the ends that she does not require. The weaver then inserts the weft and beats it into the fabric. The next shed is made and the process of choosing, repeated. The black warp threads, always interlace and therefore it is only from the red or white warp threads that a choice is made.

The width of the 'UWAIRJAN can vary from 2.5 to 8 cms and the length from 1 to 9 cms. The ends per cm in the 'UWAIRJAN are always more than the ends per cm of the bordering FLAT WEAVE. This is because of the 'UWAIRJAN'S compact structure.

WARPING PLAN OF ONE 'DOT'



When heddling, instead of one warp yarn being put in a heddle and one left loose, the red and the white yarn are treated as a single warp thread and are either put together in a heddle or left out.

Three types of yarn can be used in the 'UWAIR-JAN The black background is either wool or goat, the white is either wool or cotton, and the red is wool. No examples have been seen using any other colour or yarn combination.

The 'UWAIRJAN can be seen as a vertical selvedge stripe or as part of the border to the SHAJA-RAH. The 'UWAIRJAN is usually bordered by FLAT WEAVE and the HUBUB. Many Bedouin products have this design and its most popular application is in cushions. However it can also be seen in the tent divider, on floor rugs and storage bags.








